

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

2019 Novel Coronavirus (2019nCoV) is a virus (more specifically, a coronavirus) identified as the cause of an outbreak of respiratory illness first detected in Wuhan, China. Early on, many of the patients in the outbreak in Wuhan, China reportedly had some link to a large seafood and animal market, suggesting animal-to-person spread. However, a growing number of patients reportedly have not had exposure to animal markets, indicating person-to-person spread is occurring. At this time,

it's unclear how easily or sustainably this virus is spreading between people.

For confirmed 2019-nCoV infections, reported illnesses have ranged from people with little to no symptoms to people being severely ill and dying. Symptoms can include:

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath Coronaviruses are a large family of different species of

animals, including camels, cattle, cats, and bats. Rarely, animal coronaviruses can infect people and then spread between people such as with MERS, SARS, and now with 2019-nCoV.

While the immediate risk of this new virus to the American public is believed to be low at this time, everyone can do their part to help us respond to this emerging public health threat.

February is here and we are half way through the winter season. Issues with individual thermostats are If you have any questions or concerns about the system in your apartment, ask Jeff Knox.

For those of you that may want to get rid of any unwanted items in your apartment, please contact maintenance for assistance. We will haul these items directly out of the building

for disposal without obstructing the trash rooms. What you may not know is that the trash chute has a curve in it. When you dispose being resolved as they arise. of large or long items, you clog the chute which creates a problem. So please be mindful when placing items down the chute. If you have large items to dispose of, please contact maintenance and we will take care of it. And please remember:

- 1. that all trash must be placed in plastic bags before being placed into the trash chute:
- 2. when disposing of needles or pins, placed them a safe container such as

hard plastic or a can before throwing in the trash;

3. place depends in a plastic bag before placing it in the trash room.

The service coordinator position provides information and referrals to residents in a community who need supportive services to maintain self-sufficiency. Service coordinators typically have social work or human services education and experience. The work of service coordinators aids more than one million low-income seniors, individuals with special needs and families residing in affordable housing.

Service coordinators assist lowincome seniors in identifying, locating and acquiring the services necessary for them to age in place in their own homes.

Service coordinators provide assistance and access to community-based supports, skills training and resources for low-income families to achieve self-sufficiency and economic independence.

2020 Renter's Tax Credit Refund

It's that time again. So get ready. If your yearly income falls within the limited range for one or 2 in a household, you may be eligible for a refund tax credit. My most recent conversation with the Dept of Tax Assessments advised me that applications should be available late February beginning March.





Front Desk Services:

3. If you receive a package that is too large for your mailbox, a yellow sticker will be left on your mailbox asking you to pick up the package at the Front Desk.
