MARYLAND ACCESS POINT (MAP)

This is a very good City resource if you have guestions about resources for seniors. The number is 410-396-2273. They can offer referrals for community resources, long term services and support. A person actually answers the phone (at least every time I have called with a question). You must call to start the application process. One program is called the Waiver Program and the other is The Community First Choice program. Their service referrals include: health, mental health, utilities, grocery providers, health insurance and Medicare information.


