

# Maintenance News Maurice Robinson Supervisor

All work orders must be submitted through the front desk. Please do not stop the maintenance team in the hallway or around the building to give them a work order. Residents are not permitted into the back maintenance area.



Please remember that large items are not to be placed in the trash chute. These items are clogging the trash chute and causing damage to the compactor.

Large items should be coordinated with our bulk trash provider for removal.

If you are traveling away from the building, please make sure all of your windows are closed before you leave. With winter and snowy weather approaching, we wanted to remind you of Snow and Ice Safety. We want to help avoid slips and falls. Please remember to:
Wear Proper Footwear.
Make sure your shoes have a tread-like bottoms and are not slick.
Stay Alert when walking on snow or ice covered

pavement

Be careful wear you park, and watch for melting and re-freezing snow. Icy surfaces are a lot more dangerous than they look. Stay safe and watch your step.
